## Admission Requirements

Length of Study	Students must have completed one year of study at their home university, but are able to apply for Study Abroad after one semester of results.
Grade Point Average (GPA)	The students' GPA must meet or be equivalent to at least 2.5 out of 4.0.
Language of Instruction	English

All applicants must demonstrate an acceptable level of English proficiency to gain admission to the University. Students from majority native English speaking countries (listed on our [website](#)) do not have to provide evidence of English proficiency.

There are two categories of English requirements for entry, dependent on the courses chosen:

### General Academic Level: Most undergraduate and postgraduate courses.

English Language Tests for Visa Applications	<p>Students should remain aware of the English language visa requirements determined by the Australian Department of Home Affairs and how this may differ from University entry requirements. Students must ensure that their English language proficiency test is appropriate for their student visa application. English Language Pathway Programs	<p>Students who are below the English language requirement can choose to take an English language course before their Study Abroad Program. There are fees attached to this course. ## Nomination and Application Process

Nomination by home university	<p>A nomination template will be provided to your office. This template will need to be completed and upload to Box. To maintain data security, we cannot accept nominations via direct email.</p> <p>The following details are required for nomination:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Student/ s full name (as per passport)</li> <li>• Student/ s date of birth (as per passport) e.g. 01 July 2000</li> <li>• Student/ s gender (as per passport)</li> <li>• Student/ s email address (institution email preferred)</li> <li>• Student/ s intended study period as below: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Semester 1, 2025/Full Calendar Year 2025</li> <li>• Winter School 2025</li> <li>• Semester 2 2025</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Student/s area and level of study</li> </ul> <p>Only students who have met the GPA and English language requirements should be nominated/apply.</p>
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Application Process	<p>Students will be emailed a link to our online application form and will need to upload the following documents in English: Information page of valid passport</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Official academic transcript (including past and current enrolment)</li><li>• Official English proficiency test results (if applicable)</li><li>• Details of proposed courses (Course Code, Course Number, Course Title and teaching semester)</li><li>• Copies of course descriptions/syllabi for applicable courses taken at home university (for subject areas noted in Course Assessment section below).</li></ul>
Application & Course Assessment	<p>Applications will be assessed and the students preferred courses will be sent to the appropriate faculties for approval if required. The faculties will look at the student's transcript and course descriptions from the home university to determine the students suitability for enrolment into the desired courses.</p> <p>Courses from the following areas require approval prior to enrolment: Criminology, Education, Languages, Law, MBA, Media, Music, Public Health, and Sciences.</p>
Offer & Acceptance	<p>An Offer of Admission will be emailed directly to the student, with cc to the home university. Students need to complete the payment for their Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) and Study Abroad tuition (if applicable). Details of the payment method are outlined in the Offer of Admission. Students will need to return all pages of the signed and completed Offer of Admission.</p>
Confirmation of Enrolment & Student Visa	<p>Once the OSHC payment is received and the signed Offer of Admission is returned, the University of Adelaide issues a Confirmation of Enrolment (cc to home university) which is a required document to obtain a student visa.</p> <p>All students must obtain an appropriate visa. Enrolment	<p>Welcome emails are sent 120 days before the course start date or when the admission process is completed (whichever occurs later). The welcome email contains the student's ID number and information on how to activate their account which will enable them to log in to the University's online services. Students are responsible for enrolling into their approved courses. Students are responsible for enrolling into their approved courses. Fees	<p>Study Abroad students pay tuition fees for their courses to the University of Adelaide, not to their home university. Study Abroad students incur three main costs; tuition fees, <b>living expenses</b> and <b>Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)</b>.</p> <p>2025 tuition fees are as follows: 3 units: AUD \$3 000 6 units: AUD \$6 000 9 units: AUD \$9 000 12 units: AUD \$12 000</p> <p>To see a breakdown of these costs and other costs associated with Study Abroad, visit the <b>fees</b> page.</p>

## Academic Information

Course Selection & Information	<p>Students can select from a wide range of courses. We recommend that students' selections are flexible. Students who are very restricted in their course selection need to inform us as early as possible. All courses offered are subject to change and availability.</p>
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Unavailable & Restricted Courses	<p>Unavailable Courses - courses not offered to Study Abroad students. A 'N' will be listed in the course outlines. Study areas not open to Study Abroad students: Biomedical Studies, Dentistry, Indonesian, Italian, Medical Studies, Modern Greek, Museum and Curatorial Studies, Music Theatre, Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Oral Health, Physiotherapy and Speech Pathology.</p> <p>Restricted Courses – courses may be available but have prerequisites and/ or limited availability.</p> <p>Courses that require assessment and approval are from the following areas: Criminology, Education, Languages, Law, MBA, Media, Music, Public Health, Sciences.</p> <p>Further information about unavailable and restricted courses can be found at: <a href="https://adelaide.edu.au/inbound-study-abroad/choosing">adelaide.edu.au/inbound-study-abroad/choosing</a></p>
Course Levels	<p>1XXX - 3XXX = Undergraduate courses.</p> <p>Eg: ARTS 1000 - Introductory Level, ARTS 2000 - Intermediate Level, ARTS 3000 Advanced Level.</p> <p>4XXX = Honours courses. Mostly restricted with some exceptions provided at faculty discretion.</p> <p>5XXX - 7XXX = Postgraduate courses. Only available to Study Abroad students who have completed an Undergraduate degree (or equivalent).</p> <p>Students are not able to study Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses concurrently.</p>
Course Weighting	<p>Courses offered are usually weighted at 3 units each. The full-time semester course load requirement is between 9 units (75% workload) and 12 units (100% workload). Trimester based students are required to study a maximum of 9 units per Trimester.</p> <p>12 UoA units = 30 ECTS = 60 UK Credits = 15 US Credits</p>
Campuses	<p>The University of Adelaide has 3 campuses. <a href="#">Take a virtual tour</a></p> <p>Studying across multiple campuses may be challenging and therefore not recommended unless students can organise a practical timetable that allows for travel between campuses.</p> <p><b>North Terrace:</b> Located in the central business district. This is the University of Adelaide's main campus and the site of most teaching activities.</p> <p><b>Roseworthy:</b> Located over an hour north of the CBD, this campus is an internationally renowned for dryland agriculture and animal production. Course codes ending in RW are taught at this campus. This includes: Animal Science, Veterinary Science and Veterinary Technology.</p> <p><b>Waite:</b> Located 20 minutes south of the and home to the largest centre of agricultural research and teaching expertise in the Southern Hemisphere. Course codes end in WT are taught at this campus. This includes Agricultural Science, Food Science, Oenology, Plant Science, Soil and Water, Spatial Science and Viticulture.</p> <p>Students and staff can also make use of the <a href="#">Inter Campus Shuttle Bus</a> service 'University Shuttle' which travels between campus locations. The timetable is limited.</p>
Internships	<p>It may be possible for students to incorporate an Internship experience into their Study Abroad Program. The University of Adelaide has a well equipped Internships Office to help facilitate students expanding their skills outside of the classroom. Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)	<p>It is a condition of the student visa to have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) insurance for the entire length of stay in Australia.</p> <p>If students are visiting from Norway, Sweden, or Belgium, special OSHC conditions may apply. Please see the <a href="#">Department of Home Affairs</a> for further information.</p> <p>The University of Adelaide works with Medibank and is able to facilitate ordering the <a href="#">Comprehensive OSHC</a> on behalf of students. Students will be provided an OSHC quote in their Offer of Admission.</p> <p>If students choose to purchase OSHC through a different approved provider or are exempt, we will request evidence showcasing their alternative coverage, including coverage period before progressing the admission.</p>
Official Transcript	<p>Study Overseas will order the official transcript on the students' behalf upon release of their final grades and completion of the program.</p> <p>Transcripts will be issued digitally via the platform My eEquals. This platform allows students to securely share with their home university.
