Admission Requirements

Length of Study	Students must have completed one year of study at their home university, but are able to apply for Study Abroad after one semester of results.
Grade Point Average (GPA)	The students' GPA must meet or be equivalent to at least 2.5 out of 4.0.
Language of Instruction	English

All applicants must demonstrate an acceptable level of English proficiency to gain admission to the University. Students from majority native English speaking countries (listed on our website) do not have to provide evidence of English proficiency.

There are two categories of English requirements for entry, dependent on the courses chosen:

 Students will be emailed a link to our online application form and will need to upload the following documents in English:Information page of valid passport Official academic transcript (including past and current enrolment) Official English proficiency test results (if applicable) Details of proposed courses (Course Code, Course Number, Course Title and teaching semester) Copies of course descriptions/syllabi for applicable courses taken at home university (for subject areas noted in Course Assessment section below).
Applications will be assessed and the students preferred courses will be sent to the appropriate faculties for approval if required. The faculties will look at the student's transcript and course descriptions from the home university to determine the students suitability for enrolment into the desired courses. Courses from the following areas require approval prior to enrolment: Criminology, Education, Languages, Law,
MBA, Media, Music, Public Health, and Sciences.
An Offer of Admission will be emailed directly to the student, with cc to the home university. Students need to complete the payment for their Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) and Study Abroad tuition (if applicable). Details of the payment method are outlined in the Offer of Admission. Students will need to return all pages of the signed and completed Offer of Admission.
Once the OSHC payment is received and the signed Offer of Admission is returned, the University of Adelaide issues a Confirmation of Enrolment (cc to home university) which is a required document to obtain a student visa.

 Study Abroad students pay tuition fees for their courses to the University of Adelaide, not to their home university. Study Abroad students incur three main costs; tuition fees, living expenses and Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). 2025 tuition fees are as follows: 3 units: AUD \$3 000 6 units: AUD \$6 000 9 units: AUD \$9 000 12 units: AUD \$12 000 To see a breakdown of these costs and other costs associated with Study Abroad, visit the fees page.

Academic Information

Course Selection & Information Students can select from a wide range of courses. We recommend that students' selections are flexible. Students who are very restricted in their course selection need to inform us as early as possible. All courses offered are subject to change and availability.



Unavailable & Restricted Courses	Unavailable Courses - courses not offered to Study Abroad students. A 'N' will be listed in the course outlines. Study areas not open to Study Abroad students: Biomedical Studies, Dentistry, Indonesian, Italian, Medical Studies, Modern Greek, Museum and Curatorial Studies, Music Theatre, Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Oral Health, Physiotherapy and Speech Pathology.
	Restricted Courses – courses may be available but have prerequisites and/ or limited availability.

	Students are not able to study Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses concurrently.
Course Weighting	Courses offered are usually weighted at 3 units each. The full-time semester course load requirement is between 9 units (75% workload) and 12 units (100% workload). Trimester based students are required to study a maximum of 9 units per Trimester.

Campuses	The University of Adelaide has 3 campuses. Take a virtual tour
	Studying across multiple campuses may be challenging and therefore not recommended unless students can organise a practical timetable that allows for travel between campuses.
	North Terrace: Located in the central business district. This is the University of Adelaide's main campus and the site of most teaching activities.
	Roseworthy: Located over an hour north of the CBD, this campus is an internationally renowned for dryland agriculture and animal production.Course codes ending in RW are taught at this campus. This includes: Animal Science, Veterinary Science and Veterinary Technology.
	Waite: Located 20 minutes south of the and home to the largest centre of agricultural research and teaching expertise in the Southern Hemisphere. Course codes end in WT are taught at this campus. This includes Agricultural Science, Food Science, Oenology, Plant Science, Soil and Water, Spatial Science and Viticulture.
	Students and staff can also make use of the Inter Campus Shuttle Bus service 'University Shuttle' which travels between campus locations. The timetable is limited.
Internships	It may be possible for students o incorporate an Internship experience into their Study Abroad Program. The University of Adelaide has a well equipped Internships Office to help facilitate students expanding their skills outside of the classroom. To learn more, visit the Student Internships website. Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)	It is a condition of the student visa to have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) insurance for the entire length of stay in Australia.
	If students are visiting from Norway, Sweden, or Belgium, special OSHC conditions may apply. Please see the Department of Home Affairs for further information.
	The University of Adelaide works with Medibank and is able to facilitate ordering the Comprehensive OSHC on behalf of students. Students will be provided an OSHC quote in their Offer of Admission.
	If students choose to purchase OSHC through a different approved provider or are exempt, we will request evidence showcasing their alternative coverage, including coverage period before progressing the admission.
Official Transcript	Study Overseas will order the official transcript on the students' behalf upon release of their final grades and completion of the program.
	Transcripts will be issued digitally via the platform My eQuals. This platform allows students to securely share with their home university. Study Overseas is not provided access to the transcript and therefore is unable to share on behalf of the students.
